## From the Rabbi's Desk

October, November, and December are times of change. The seasons begin to change from feverishly hot summer days to brutally cold, snowy nights. These three months are the middle ground most of the time. Now the air is brisk, but comfortable. A light jacket will keep away the chills we know are coming. This time is both our link to the past and our anticipation of the future.

We spend a good amount of our lives looking back and remembering. This is clear to me at every funeral I officiate. The more we remember, the bigger our smiles, the less painful our tears.

Our memories are subjective of course. Many times, we remember the same event as someone else, only completely differently. And yet, somehow, the minutiae of the memory does not always matter. It is enough to simply share a past.

We also spend a great deal of time thinking about the future. We plan for the future – by packing an umbrella in case of rain, or saving for a trip or house improvement. Some of us daydream about our possible future plans and lives. Thinking about the future gives us hope. It gives us something more to live for.

## Cantor's Notes

Every High Holy Day we sing the *Un'taneh Tokef* Prayer as part of the Amidah. The basic meaning of this prayer is: "Let us describe the power of the holiness of this day, for it is awesome and fearsome... You will open the Book of Remembrances, and it will be read by itself, an the signature of every person is within it.... On Rosh Hashanah it will be inscribed, and on the day of the fast of Yom Kippur, it will be sealed how many will pass away, and how many will be created, who will live, and

who will die... but repentance, prayer and charity nullify the harsh sentence...."

The *Un'taneh Tokef* Prayer was written approximately one thousand years ago. Because of the dramatic and moving imagery it also was included during the Yom Kippur service. This powerful prayer was intended to evoke a sense of trepidation and awe as we stand before God's throne for judgment, as if all of humanity passes before God like sheep beneath the staff.

Not only does this prayer describe the frailty and transience of humanity, and the fear that we should feel, it also notes God's supreme mercy, noting that by changing one's heart and life will overturn even the most severe decree of punishment.

The *Un'taneh Tokef* is recited prior to the Kedusha Prayer focusing on Divine Judgment. There are four paragraphs to the *Un'taneh Tokef*. This theme of divine decree comes in part to a Talmudic Teaching: "On Rosh Hashanah, three books are opened [in Heaven] – one for the thoroughly wicked, one for the thoroughly righteous, and one for those in-between. The thoroughly righteous are immediately inscribed clearly in the Book of Life. The thoroughly wicked are immediately inscribed clearly in the Book of Death. The fate of those in-between is postponed from Rosh Hashanah until Yom Kippur, at which time those who are deserving are then inscribed in the Book of Death." (T.B., *Rosh Hashana* 16b). As a token of this belief, the common greeting on Rosh HaShanah is *l'Shanah tovah tikatev* – May you be inscribed for a good year.

Leonard Cohen was inspired by this prayer to create a song "Who By Fire" after singing in front of Israeli soldiers in the frontier in the Yom Kippur War in 1973.

There are times when the past meets the present. For all intents and purposes – there are Novembers all the time. At a baby naming or a bris, the parents share their dreams for their child's future. We recite blessings to protect the baby all throughout his or her life. We ask that God guide the child through hardships as well as joys. It is a future oriented moment. And yet, we often name our children after people in our lives who have passed. We remember all our past loved ones who helped make the day possible by their existence. At this anticipated moment of future-thinking, we also turn around to view the past. We ask that the child grow in their future as wonderful as the people in their past. We share the lives of our great-grandparents and how this new baby fulfills their future visions.

Yes, there are times when the past meets the future. It is now. In the change of the seasons. For that matter it is always now. Every moment we live, every breath we breathe is a moment where the past meets the future. Our past catches up with us and our future slows down to join us on our path. Enjoy this moment – a moment when it all comes together. The time is now.

The lyrics to this powerful song reflect Leonard Cohen's feeling on the *Un'taneh Tokef* prayer:

*"And who by fire, who by water, who in the sunshine, who in the night time, who by high ordeal, who by common trial, who in your merry, merry month of may, who by very slow decay, and who shall I say is calling?"*

*And who in her lonely slip, who by barbiturate, who in these realms of love, who by something blunt, and who by avalanche, who by powder, who for his greed, who for his hunger, and who shall I say is calling?"*

*And who by brave assent, who by accident, who in solitude, who in this mirror, who by his lady's command, who by his own hand, who in mortal chains, who in power, and who shall I say is calling?"*

As we hear the sound of the Shofar and the Prayers of the High Holy Days, let us remember to reflect, not only about the people we have been over the past year, but also on how we can be better for this next year of 5785.

From my wife Kathy and our sons Nathan and Aaron and our future Daughter-in-Law Hannah we want to wish all of you *L'Shanah Tovah Tikatev* – "May we all be inscribed for a good year."

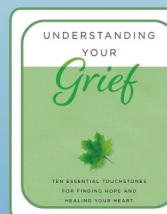

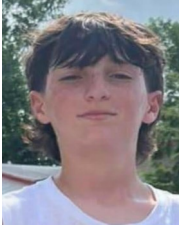

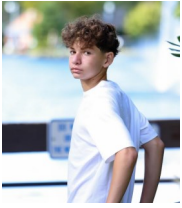
## *Mazel Tov to our B'nei Mitzvah*

# Mitzvah Goreret Mitzvah

*One good deed leads to another good deed*

The **Mitzvah/Caring Committee** is responsible for doing “acts of kindness” (Mitzvahs) for both our congregation, our local community and outside communities around us as well. For our congregants, if anyone is ever in need of the services of The Mitzvah Committee, please call the Main Office and they will contact us so that we can help. Our mission is to be there in all times of need!

Keeping the above in mind, The Mitzvah/Caring Committee of NSS this past June, reached out to the family of Rabbi Jenn Weinstein of Congregation Simchat HaLev in Woodbury after they suffered a tragedy in their family. Rabbi Jenn’s wife suddenly passed away while giving birth to twin daughters. After Rabbi Shalhevet brought this to our attention, The Mitzvah Committee sent in a Shabbat Dinner for the family. We wanted them to know that their friends at North Shore Synagogue cared and that they were in our thoughts and prayers. The Weinstein family was very appreciative.

During the Summer months, our Mitzvahs continued:

### Filling The Rudman Food Pantry

In August, The Mitzvah Committee was informed that The Rudman Food Pantry at the Mid-Island Y in Plainview was in desperate need of 8 items – four food item and 4 household items. Thanks to Jill Schubert, one of our Mitzvah Committee members bringing this to our attention, we quickly purchased \$500 worth of the items they needed. Gail Warrack, the Director of Volunteer Services at the Mid-Island Y was very appreciative of our effort to help and deliver the items they needed in a timely fashion.

### UJA Backpack Mitzvah

On August 13<sup>th</sup>, The Mitzvah Committee, in conjunction with NSS Sisterhood, hosted an event to fill backpacks with school supplies for underserved children. We partnered with “Supplies for Success”, which is a non-profit organization that originated as a UJA Committee. The Mitzvah Committee and NSS Sisterhood each donated \$1000 to provide 100 backpacks filled with supplies to those in need. Members of The Mitzvah Committee and NSS Sisterhood came together on August 13 to fill these 100 backpacks with the school supplies. Our congregants were also asked to donate supplies and/or money and their time to help in this annual project. These backpacks were distributed by The People’s Pantry of Oyster Bay which serves families in need in both the Oyster Bay and Manhasset communities.

### High Holiday Food Drive

During the month of October, The Mitzvah Committee will be collecting certain requested food items to be donated to The Rudman Food Pantry of the Mid-Island Y. As done in the past, brown bags will be given out during Rosh Hashanah services with a list of the need food items. Once these bags are filled they can be brought back to the Synagogue during Yom Kippur or at anytime during the month of October. Please note: For those who may be watching services virtually, bags can be picked up at the Main Office during October and dropped back at the Synagogue. Additionally, a list of the food items will be emailed to our congregants during this period and you can use any bag to transport food back to the Synagogue.

During the Fall months, The Mitzvah Committee will be planning events for our congregation to take part in. Some of the events now planned include:

**Our Annual Coat Drive through TANS ( Tikkun Alliance of the North Shore)** – We will be collecting lightly worn and clean children and adult winter coats and accessories ( gloves, hats, scarves). These items will be donated to The Gerald Ryan Center in Wyandanch, which serves people in need in the Wyandanch community.

**Our Annual Thanksgiving Day Morning Mitzvah ( Thursday November 28)** – Our congregants of all ages come together early Thanksgiving morning to prepare, cook and deliver complete fresh Thanksgiving meals with all of the trimmings. Last Thanksgiving (2023), 110 NSS volunteers came together and 550 meals were made! These meals were delivered to 10 different organizations/ shelters as well as to individuals living in Nassau and Suffolk counties. It is truly an amazing and worthwhile Mitzvah to be part off. Watch for details to follow!

**Knitzvah Group** – We are looking for congregants who knit or crochet to come together to meet and make certain size squares for lap blankets. These blankets will be distributed where needed to those who are ill or are receiving treatment. Watch for details!

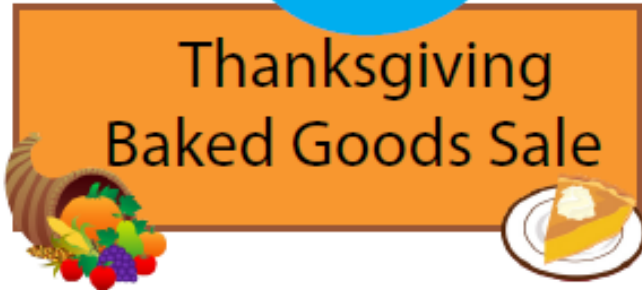
**The Challah Prince, Idan Chabasov, at North Shore Synagogue**
